Genre Information

Realistic Fiction: A story using made-up characters that could be used in real life.

Mystery: A suspenseful story about a puzzling event that is not solved until the end of the story.

Science Fiction: A type of fantasy that uses science and technology (robots, machines, etc.)

<u>Historical Fiction</u>: A fictional story that takes place in a particular time period in the past. Often the setting is real, but the characters are made up from the author's imagination.

<u>Fantasy</u>: A story including elements that are impossible such as talking animals or magical powers. Make-believe is what this genre is all about!

<u>Myth/Folktale/Fable:</u> This may also look like Classical Literature, however for this category, a picture book/short story is acceptable. Examples: Books about Greek mythology, Red Riding Hood, Goldilocks and the Three Bears, The Three Little Pigs, The Tortoise and the Hare.

<u>Humor:</u> The humor genre may fit into many different categories, including, but not limited to: Graphic Novels, Realistic Fiction, Fantasy. If your student finds a book humorous, we do too! Humorous author examples: Dav Pilkey, Jeff Kinney, Mo Willems, Beverly Cleary.

Graphic Novel: A story written in comic-strip form, and published as a book.

<u>Classic Literature</u>: Classic literature is considered to be well-known and considered to be of a high literacy standard and a work of enduring excellence. Unless a young Griffin reader, a chapter book should be read for this category.

<u>Non-Fiction Informational:</u> Nonfiction includes any content or text that is factual. The purpose of informational texts is to inform or instruct the reader in some way.

<u>Non-Fiction Biography:</u> A written story of a person's life. (For the purpose of this club, autobiographies are included in this category. An autobiography is a written account of a person's life in their own words.)

<u>Poetry:</u> Poetry is verse written to create a response of thought and feeling from the reader. It often uses rhythm and rhyme to help convey its meaning.

Award Winning Book: Any book that received any kind of reward. Your choice of what award and what genre.

You Choose: Your choice of any book in the world. Challenge yourself!
